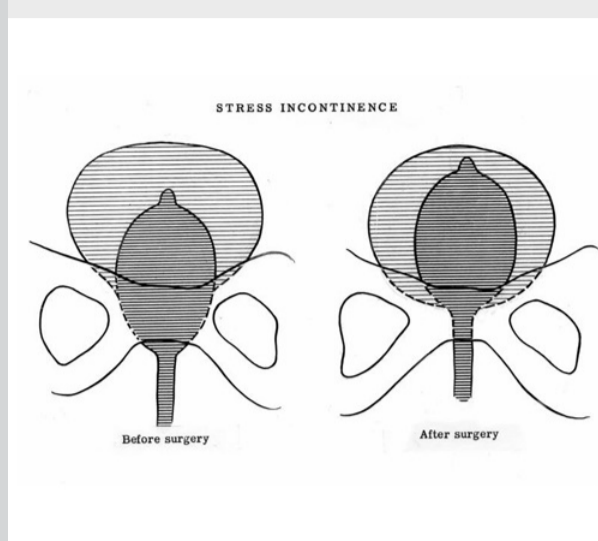

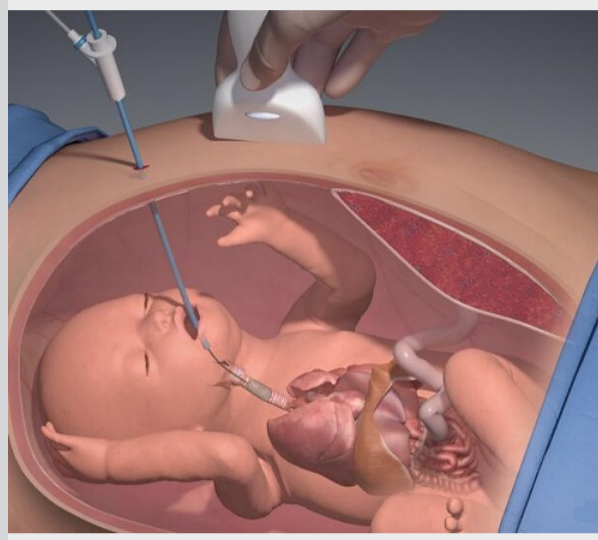

A study published in the American Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology found that patients' expectations for stress urinary incontinence (SUI) success were lower than the stringent medical definition of success.

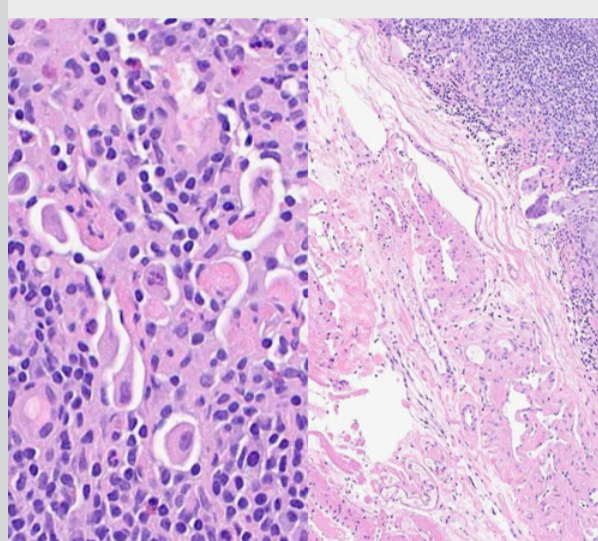

FETO reduces infant ECMO need postbirth

A multisite study found a potential morbidity reduction — lowered need for extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO) — in a subpopulation of infants with severe, left-sided congenital diaphragmatic hernia treated with fetoscopic endoluminal tracheal occlusion (FETO).

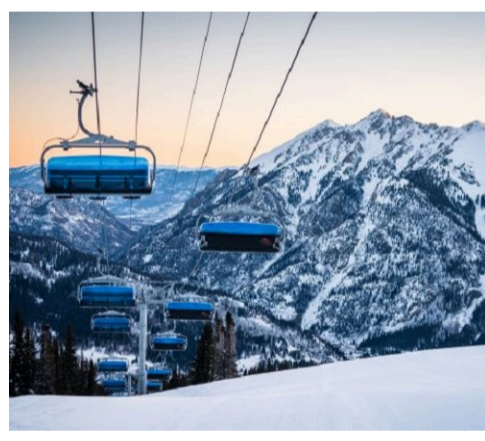
